I'd like to introduce myself. I am Cherie Mondrella, Assistant Director, Membership – Heart of the Community & Activities and one of my responsibilities will be the annual Blessing of the Bikes. My love and admiration for the Moose Riders all began when I experienced my first “*Blessing of the Bikes*” event. Since that day when I first heard the loud rumblings of motors and laid eyes on the breathtaking caravan of motorcycles cruising down the streets of Mooseheart’s campus, I was hooked! As I stared in amazement something very important happened – My mind opened to the world of Moose Riders, and to the possibilities this group holds the key to for this great Moose fraternity.

As a Family Teacher at that time, I took my seven little Mooseheart boys, ages 6-9, from our “*Tennessee Home*” out to the curbside and we saw a seemingly endless stream of bikes pass by. It was truly MAGICAL! To see my boys light up like that, absolutely star-struck at the sight of it all, was a real gift as they waved excitedly at all of the “*Cool dudes*” they saw. To see the expressions the boys’ faces and on the countless benevolent riders’ faces as each passed and waved at us was a priceless experience.

At the field house parking lot, we were suddenly submerged in the Moose Rider culture. I was blown away by the tremendous effort these people had made, coming together from all areas for this one cause. The boys thought this was the “*coolest thing ever*” and I agreed! A few of them said things like, “They don’t look like Moose members,” and, “They’re not wearing what Moose members wear.” To 6 year old boys ‘Moose members’ are the traditional-looking people that have come into their home and have given them hugs and gift cards. I told them that, regardless of what a Moose member wears, or how many tattoos or long beards they have, a Moose member on a motorcycle is still a Moose member. I told them these Moose Riders paid for our house, for our food, and for our clothes by being a member -- just like the other Moose members.

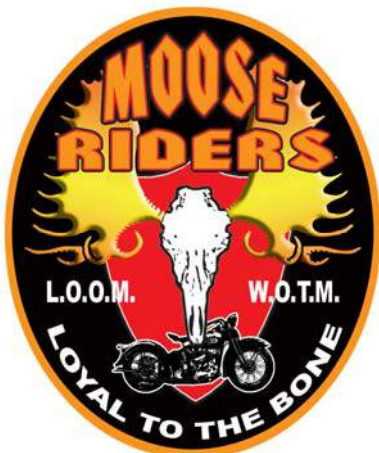
Many of the Riders spoke with the boys, and I saw the love and compassion in their eyes-- I knew this group really ‘gets it.’

Let’s face it, the Moose Riders image is far from that of “traditional” Moose members. To me, that’s a beautiful thing! Our focus, then, should be on that mutual passion, on our similarities -- rather than on our differences. My knowledge of the Moose Riders was limited to the “*Blessing of the Bikes*” event. I would later learn just how valuable this ‘sub-group’ of our membership really is. I became friends with Moose Riders Lodges on Facebook and saw postings of numerous benevolent efforts. I spoke to a handful of Moose Riders and have gained tremendous insights and learned that Moose Riders do a *fantastic* job of raising significant amounts of money to support our Mooseheart youth and our seniors at Moosehaven and other causes in their communities. I truly believe that every Lodge should have a Moose Riders group! Just imagine how much *more* impact we could have out there if that happened!

I am very excited and honored that I now have the privilege to work with this special group of members. I want you all to know that I am behind the Moose Riders all the way! 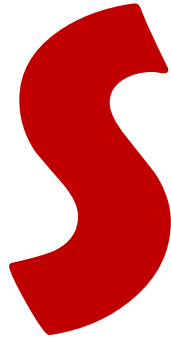

December 6, 2015, should have been like any other day. It was a typically beautiful, warm, sunny, December Florida day, but this day was quite different than the others. This was the first Sunday in December. This is the day that the Riverview Moose Riders were looking forward to early in this 2015 Holiday season. This was the day we make the children of East Hillsborough County smile. This was the day we get to shake the hand of a homeless Veteran of Liberty Manor and thank them for their sacrifice and service. This is the day we feel privileged to be able to participate in the annual Cookson Hills Toy Run.

With the loss of one of the founders of the Cookson Hills Toy Run, Bill Brown, this year's event was bittersweet. Bill and his wife Sherri started this event in 1993. For 22 years and counting, the Cookson Hills Toy Run has been providing Christmas memories for the “Forgotten” children of East Hillsborough County, Florida. This event started out as simply a good deed and provided gifts and Christmas memories for 18 children. Since that first Sunday of December 1993, the event has grown to include needy children from newborn to 18 years old, low income seniors, special

dropping them in a box. YOU personally present the gifts directly to the “Forgotten” that are invited, becoming a part of their lives, experiencing the joy and happiness when your Christmas gifts are opened while you watch.

We were introduced to this event in 2010 by our now Past Moose Rider President, Carl Lemay. Carl told us about this event that he had attended for a few years and encouraged us to join him and his family on this toy run. After attending our first Cookson Hills Toy Run with only a handful of gifts, we have been hooked since. This event is so touching and emotional that we went all in the following year.

Starting after Halloween every year, the Riverview Moose Riders begin preparation for this annual event. The Christmas tree in our Lobby is decorated with ornaments listing the age, gender and gift ideas for a child, senior or the Veterans of Cookson Hills. Members are asked to take as many ornaments as they wish and purchase gifts for those individuals. The Friday after Thanksgiving, all of the toys are laid out in our hall and the wrapping paper, ribbon and tape starts flying. With well over 200 gifts every year, it’s a daunting task made easy with the help of our great riders and Lodge members. Within a few hours, all of the

gifts are wrapped, labeled, boxed and loaded in to our trailer to await this day...the first Sunday in December.

With the large pink Teddy Bears, last minute gifts and giant monkeys loaded on the bikes, the Riverview Moose Riders head to the Lodge to meet up with our fellow riders and Lodge Members. From there, two-wheelers, three-

wheelers, trucks, trailers and mini vans all headed out to Veterans Park in Tampa, FL, where we meet up with riders and old friends from past toy runs. At 2pm, the gift giving begins. Hundreds of bikers from all over Tampa Bay hand out their gifts to the children, seniors, special needs adults and Veterans. Shortly afterwards, we all get to watch the huge smiles, the joyful gasps and the tears of

joy and happiness as these precious individuals open their gifts.

Six weeks of preparation. Many hours of fund raising, shopping, wrapping and counting gifts. One hour to hand out gifts. 30 minutes of surprises and smiles as the children and others open their gifts. Every invested minute is well worth it. There is no better way to start your Christmas Holiday season than the experience of the Cookson Hills Toy Run.

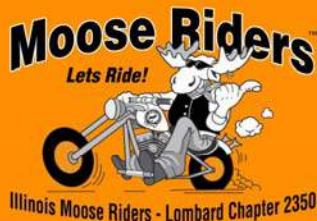

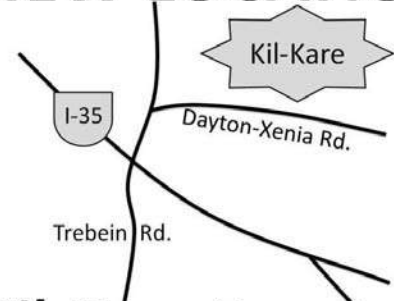

Christmas Run Aids Less Fortunate Children/Families

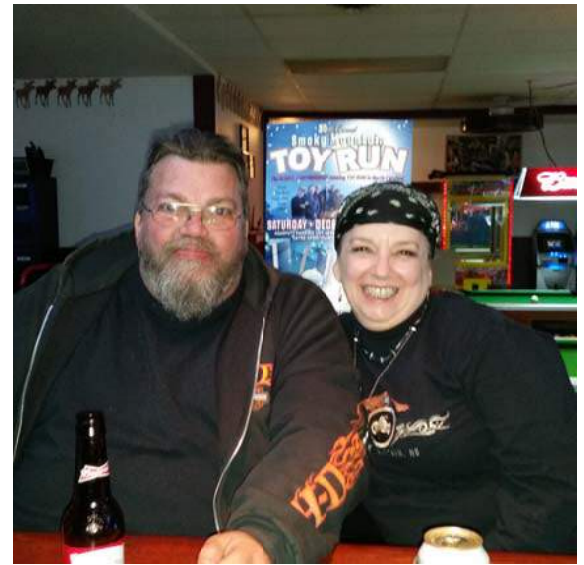

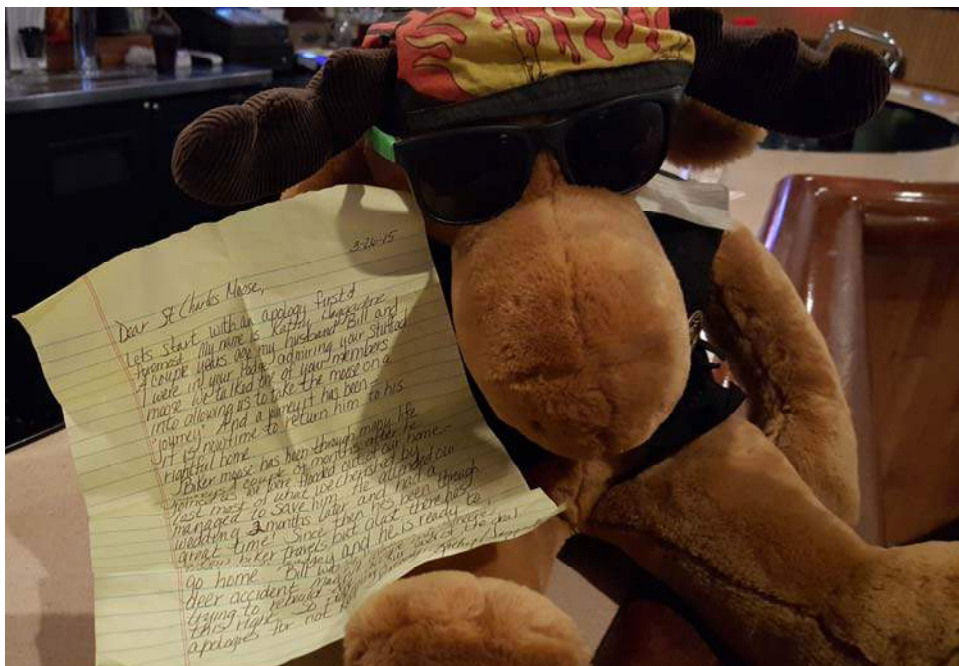

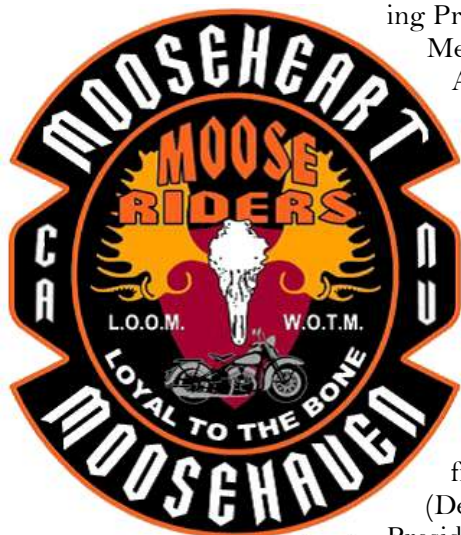
Our activity group still does functions with local community charities and the
